

Signs of an opioid overdose

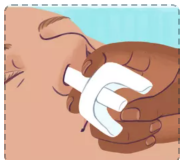
- › Unresponsiveness or unconsciousness
- › Slowed or stopped breathing
- › Snoring or rattling sounds
- › Cold or clammy skin
- › Discolored lips or fingernails

ACT IMMEDIATELY

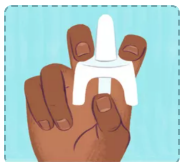
Call **911** and follow the operator's instructions. Give rescue breaths if needed, and continue breaths every 5–6 seconds.

STEP BY STEP

How to administer nasal naloxone



- 1 Place the tip of the naloxone nozzle in either nostril until your fingers touch the nose.



- 2 Press the plunger firmly to release the dose of naloxone.



2–3 MIN

- 3 If there is no response after 2–3 minutes, give a second dose. Stay with the person until help arrives.

You can save a life.
